Impact of Sports Funding 2019

In September 2013, new funding was made available to schools to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.

During 2018-2019 these were the things we wanted to achieve:

- Engage all pupils in regular physical activity of at least 2 hours per week.
- Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching and assessing PE and sport.
- At least 80% of children to join a sports club after school or in lunch times.
- Increase participation in competitive sport.
- To develop a skills progression document and an assessment tracker across the school.
- Increase the profile of PE across the school and the surrounding communities.

Allocated sports funding was £16,882
