Impact of Sports Funding 2020

In September 2013, new funding was made available to schools to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.

During 2019-2020 we wanted to achieve these things:

- Every child participates in 2 hours of PE.
- 85% of children attend a sports club
- Achieve Silver School Games Award.
- Increase profile of PE as a subject within school
- Embed Forest school across the school.
- Embed swimming across the school.
- Identify children who are working at higher standards in comparison to their peers.

Allocated sports funding was £2,365 from last year plus £16,882 totalling £19,247.
